Ten traines become internationally certified Zumba Instructors



The 51st Batch De-suung Accelerated Training Programme for Executives concluded on August 14, 2022 at the Military Training Centre in Tencholing, Wangdiphodrang.

The 51st Batch comprises of 244 males and 42 females (286 in total) who are Government Officials, Private Sector heads and officials from the Tourism sector.

With the conclusion of the two weeks training, the total De-suups in the country is now 30,311 (18,575 male and 11,736 Female).

The Orientation ceremony for the 51st batch was held on 19th August at the De-suung club house in Thimphu.
