

#### Recitation of seven-lined supplication to Guru Padmasambhava- prayer ceremony at Kuenselphodrang

A total of 80 De-suups (44 males and 36 females) were deployed to Kuenselphodrang on November 15, 2022 for monitoring and assisting in the 100,000 recitation of seven-lined supplicaion to Guru Padhamsambhava (Tshikdoen Seldoen) prayer ceremony.

The five-day religious ceremony is being presided over by Lam Namkhai Nyingpo Rinpoche and will end on November 23, 2022.

The Institute of Skills and Management Studies (ISMS), Thimphu, was the training provider, and 19 De-suups participated in the program for a duration of three months in Thimphu.



#### **DE-SUUNG COORDINATION HUBS**



The deployment of De-suups will be carried out from the magazones in the future. This is carried out to enhance coordination of De-suups in Thimphu where there are over 7000 De-suups at the moment. Therefore, there will be four mega zones and mega hubs to cater to the service of the community.

The coordination hubs will also serve as the search and rescue center for the mega zones. In future, all activities such as reporting & briefing will be carried out at the respective mega hubs. The mega hubs will also create the opportunities for the De-suups to walk in and work from the hub.

#### **MOENLAM CHENMO**



A total of 157 De-suups were deployed for the Moenlam Chenmo, which occurred at the Samtse Higher Secondary School's football ground. Lam Yeshi, the Lam Neten of Samtse, presided over the Moenla Chenmo. Volunteers for the religious ceremony also included 33 personnel from the Royal Bhutan Police (RBP), scouts, teachers, students, the Red Cross, and 20 people each from Norgaygang, Tendril, and Pemaling Gewogs.

The ceremony was also attended by the Dasho Dzongdag of Samtse, Dasho Drangpoens (Samtse and Dophuchen Dungkhag), Dasho Dungpas (Trashochoeling and Dophuchen Dungkhag), 15 Gups of the 15 Gewogs, and the regional and sector heads of various agencies.

The event was organized by the Samtse Dzongkhag Administration and Samtse Dratshang.

#### THIMPHU CLEANING CAMPAIGN

De-suups were divided into five groups to carry out the cleaning campaign in Thimphu's various places. On November 16, the first group cleaned from Olakha till the Welcome Gate in Thimphu.

On the next day, 140 De-suups (48 males and 92 females) which included trainees from 6th batch of the Fire training, De-suups instructors, Deployment team from Headquarters, and De-suups from National Environment Commission (NEC) were divided into four teams to cover the Chuzom, Namselling, and Sisina areas.

The Chuzom team comprised of 26 De-suups (25 females, 1 male, and 2 NEC De-suups). The team collected 25 bags of waste.

The Sisina team comprised of 22 De-suups (5 females, 15 males, and 2 NEC De-suups). The team collected 80 bags of waste.

The Namseling team comprised of 20 De-suups (5 females and 15 males). The team collected 40 bags of waste.

The fourth group which comprised of the Fire trainees formed the banner team and put up the banners of awareness from the Welcome Gate.

The teams collected 145 bags of waste in total from the cleaning areas. Five waste collector vehicles were arranged by the Thimphu City Corporation for the initiative.

#### **DSP: DRIVING**



On November 16, 2022, 20 De-suups completed the month-long De-suung Skilling Programme - Driving training at Tongling center in Radhi, Trashigang. The closing ceremony was graced by the Dasho Dzongdag of Trashigang with the Gup, Superintendent of Police (SP) and the eight instructors also in attendance.

The trainees were awarded certificate of completion.





#### MOD-LOFE MORACLE

My name is Namgay. I am 50 years old, and I am from Lobesa, in Punakha. I was always very interested in becoming a De-suup. Hence, I was overwhelmed when we, the ex-monks, were given the opportunity to undergo the 36th batch of De-suung training in 2019.

Right after the completion of my De-suung training. I underwent D36 training in Gelephu in December of 2019. During the pandemic, my first duty was for a month with the Food Corporation of Bhutan (FCB) to unload the rice bags. After that, I served for 24 days in Lobesa during the first lockdown. I was also among the first batch of Southern Border Duty (SBD) de-suups deployed at Gelephu for 33 days. When I got back to Lobesa, I was put in charge of Search and Rescue (SAR) for the second group for 23 days.

After that, I was appointed the Gojay of the quarantine facility for the students of Thinleygang. Later, I served the physical distance at Lobesa for 11 days.

I was appointed Gojay for Punakha Dzong Zhabtog for 71 days. I finished the year 2020 by getting training at the Military Training Academy in Lobesa on how to handle weapons in a special way. I also served for 24 days during the second lockdown in Punakha. Following that, I had the opportunity to attend 38 days of Search and Rescue training in Lobesa.

I decided to go and serve SBD again. This time, I led the team and served as Gojay for SBD Gelephu for 3 months and a week (97 days).

In January 2022, I served NBD for 4 months (120 days) in Tashi Yangtse. After that, I served as the Gojay for Thimphu Greening as well as the Gojay for the Thimphu Welcome Gate Project Gojay for 4 months. I also participated in the Trans Bhutan Trail bridge construction for 10 days.

I want to thank His Majesty from the bottom of my heart for letting us become De-suups and giving us the chance to serve His Majesty and our country.

Before De-suung training, I was terminally sick and not able to work properly. It's a miracle that all of my illnesses have vanished since becoming a De-suup. I believe that by working with a pure heart and dedication, we can achieve enlightenment in this life.
