Closing of DSP in Driving Training



DOG SHELTER CONSTRUCTED IN NAKULA, THIMPHU



- On January 4, 2022, an incredible three-week effort to build a dog shelter at Nakula in Thimphu came to a close. Zimpoen Wom Dasho Sonam Thinley attended the event and thanked everyone who helped with the project. The gathering was also attended by local leaders and authorities representing program stakeholders. Zimpoen Wom honored De-suups with NADPM and RCP NS pins in recognition of their outstanding contributions.
 - The tokha soelra, which began with the offering of Gyalpoi Zhabten for His Majesty The King's well-being, added a particular touch to the occasion. The dog shelters are intended to provide relief to residents who are concerned about dog attacks as well as a safe refuge for the dogs to live without fear.
 - Since December 8, 2022, a total of 30 De-suups have been hired to clear the land and build the dog shelter.



PARO DZONGKHAG NANGCHOE LAYRIM



A total of 13 De-suups were involved in Nangchoe duty for children in Drugyel, Lango, Doteng, Shari, and Woochu, which began on December 27, 2022, and would end on January 21, 2023. De-suups are present to assist the children taking part in the Nang Choe Layrim.

NADPM IN TRASHIYANGTSE



- On December 31, 2022, Trashi Yangtse Dzongkhag achieved 100% sterilization of free-roaming, unowned dogs within their jurisdictions in fulfillment of the conditions and field validation process completed on December 25, 2022.
 - A total of 1141 free-roaming, unowned dogs were sterilized during the entire campaign.



As soon as the training was through, I headed for border duties. I got the opportunity to coordinate, serve as the fifth and sixth SBD Coordinators, and spend 128 days (4 months) at the southern border. I also applied for a position at the De-suung office in Wangduephodrang after returning from the south. I was appointed the Treasurer on September 5, 2021, after an interview with the CPO and a team from Headquarters, and I am still one as of this writing.

During my term in office, in addition to my roles during the outbreak and other times, I was assigned additional responsibilities. I have carried out my obligations with the utmost dedication and integrity for the benefit of the citizens of Wangduephodrang Dzongkhag.

- 5. Nationally responsible for dog population management (NADPM national program)
