His Majesty The King concluded 9-day Royal Tour of the southern dzongkhags and arrived in Thimphu on 23rd April.

During the Tour, His Majesty visited Punakha, Tsirang, Sarpang and Gelephu, Samdrup Jongkhar, Samtse and Phuentsholing, meeting with members of the community represented by sector heads, civil servants, local leaders, and the private sector. His Majesty also granted Audiences to the participants of the 57th Batch Accelerated Desuung training programme. The 57th Batch training is ongoing simultaneously in Dewathang, Tendruk, Tashicholing, Jigmeling, and Tashigatshel. With 1,159 participants, the 57th batch training takes up the number of DeSuups trained so far to 38,935.

His Majesty also visited the Gyalsung Academy site being developed in Jamtsholing, Samtse, and met with the people working on the site, including participants of the Desuung for Gyalsung programme, who are being trained on the job in high-quality infrastructure development works.



Their efforts have not only made the area more visually appealing but also helped to promote environmental sustainability and create a more pleasant environment for the local community and visitors alike.






### NYAMRO CHRONICLES

#### Zhabten Prayer Flags maintenance at Kuensel Phodrang









On April 25th, 35 De-suups volunteered to replace damaged prayer flags along the roadside of Kuensel Phodrang. Some prayer flags were worn out and needed to be replaced, and some poles were unstable. With the immediate help of the volunteers, the damaged prayer flags were replaced and properly installed along the roadside from the Hindu temple towards the Buddha points. It took almost 6 hours to completely replace and remove the damaged prayer flags and poles, which were actually started at 9 am and completed at 2 pm.

#### **Local Deployment**
