The 58th batch of the Accelerated De-suung Training Program will commence from June 21st to July 11th, 2023.









Forest Fire At Khengridang









The forest fire at Khengridang, opposite Udzorong CS, started around 10 pm on June 5th, 2023. The fire burned approximately 270 acres of pine trees. It took four days to finally contain the fire, aided by rainfall. The steep slope and rugged landscape presented numerous challenges during the containment efforts. A total of 22 desuups from Udzorong, along with the police, forest officials, and the local community, worked together to control the forest fire. The firefighters successfully protected households, the community lhakhang, and the ORC. Thankfully, there were no casualties among the people. The cause of the fire has not yet been confirmed.

Plantation Survey



De-suung Takshel, in collaboration with the Department of Tourism, carried out a tree-planting initiative along the Thimphu-Paro highway. On 9th june, team of 20 Desuup volunteers, comprising 10 females and 10 males, conducted a plantation survey along the highway. The survey findings are as follows: the total number of alive and dead trees was recorded, it was observed that some shabby-looking fencing along the highway needs to be removed and reconstructed, and it was recommended that watering at least once a week and waste management should be carried out.







The second phase of the nationwide De-suung National Service Million Fruit Tree Plantation Project has begun in 16 dzongkhags, and the program is currently ongoing. In this phase, greater emphasis is being placed on planting fruit trees more effectively to reduce mortality rates. The variety of fruit trees being planted includes walnut, almond, kiwi, seedless lime, mandarin, pecan nut, avocado, mango, dragon fruit, sour soup, and macadamia nut. The Million Fruit Plantation project aims to enhance the livelihood of rural communities. The first Million Fruit Tree Plantation project was launched in March of the previous year.
