On February 14, 2011, the De-suung Integrated Training Programme began in Tencholing, Wangdue Phodrang. De-suung, which means "Guardians of Peace," is a Royal Initiative of His Majesty The King.

His Majesty The King Commanded the establishment of De-suung in response to an overwhelming supplication from the youth for an opportunity to offer their voluntary service to the nation. Thus, De-suung was created as an avenue enabling those who wanted to volunteer their time and energy in service of the nation and people.

The Training Programme's foundation is based on the spirit of volunteerism and the positive influence of community service, integrity, and civic duty ethics and values.

De-suups actively volunteer during disasters, participate in social service activities, and offer service to others throughout their lives. #### Annual Moenlam Chenmo of Punakha.

The Laytshog Lopen of the Central Monastic Body presides over the 7th Annual Moenlam Chenmo of Punakha. Approximately 700 monks and nuns are reciting prayers for the well-being of sentient beings and to bring peace and harmony to the world. The Moenlam Chenmo will last for six days and is organized by the Punakha Dzongkhag Administration Moenlam Chenmo committee.

Following the ceremony, a five-day Druk-Nang-Duechhey Rimdro will commence from Friday. This ritual, performed once every twelve years in the Dragon Year, aims to cleanse obstacles and foster peace and harmony in the country. A total of 173 De-suups from Punakha are deployed for serving and crowd management, comprising 81 male De-suups

and 92 female De-suups.

#### Inauguration of Lhayual Water Project, Sarpang.

On January 18th, 2024, a significant event unfolded in Lhayul, Chudzom gewog, Sarpang Dzongkhag, as the Lhayul Water Project was inaugurated under the auspices of the Royal Government of Bhutan (RGoB) and De-suung National Service. This vital initiative, aimed at enhancing the community's water infrastructure, spans a transmission length of 22.10 km and a distribution length of 9.20 km.

It stands as a testament to the commitment of the government towards the welfare of its citizens. The project is poised to benefit eight villages, including a Basic Health Unit (BHU) and a local school, with a total population of 1337 and 156 households.





The inauguration ceremony was graced by Lam Neten of Sarpang Dzongkhag along with the official from Sarpang Dzongkhag Administrations, De-suung Office, Royal Bhutan Army (RBA), Ministry of Information and Technology (MOIT), Gewog Administration, and the enthusiastic participation of the local community. This collaborative effort not only symbolizes the completion of a crucial project but also marks the beginning of a new chapter in the lives of the people of Chudzom gewog. As water flows into homes, it brings with the promise of improved health, education, and overall well-being, creating a more sustainable and resilient future for this vibrant community. This is the 4th water project executed at Sarpang Dzongkhag. 70 Desuups will complete the project over a span of 6 months.

#### DFS 9th Batch

30 De-suups have successfully completed a two-month course at the Fire and Rescue Service Division, RBP Changzamtok, covering forest fire fighting, structural fire safety and suppression, evacuation, coordination, and search and rescue procedures. This marks the conclusion of the 9th batch of the Desuung Fire Service (DFS).

#### The Royal Takin Preserve Zoo.

On December 29th, Team Takin Zoo organized the closing ceremony. The actual renovation of the Royal Takin Project began on October 19, 2022, and has taken almost 16 months to date. The 1st and 2nd phases have concluded successfully, and the 3rd phase is now underway. The project commenced with the deployment of 58 De-suups, comprising 38 males and 20 females. In July, 71 De-suups (36 males and 35 females) were deployed for major tasks.



Currently, there are 35 De-suups (18 females and 17 males) as the project coordinator reduced the total strength since July, focusing on smaller tasks like area beautification, weeding, cleaning, and loading/unloading construction materials.

The De-suups have volunteered with full dedication to the nation, completing landscaping and renovating footpaths and the cafeteria, constructing a water tank, toilets, a Japanese arch bridge, cafeteria, and fitting pipelines—major tasks. The 3rd phase is in progress, involving the completion of another half of the pedestrian walkway bridge and area beautification

er half of the pedestrian walkway bridge and area beaut activities like a rock garden,



wood park, picnic spot, pond, canopy, and children's park. To date, 281 De-suups (151 males and 126 females) have been deployed at the Royal Takin Preserve Zoo.
