13TH YEARS OF DE-SUUNG

The De-suung Integrated Training Programme started on February 14, 2011, at the Military Training Centre, Tencholing, Wangdue Phodrang. This program teaches volunteers basic skills to help during disasters.

The program's goal was to get ready and empower citizens to help build our nation. It focuses on teaching values and organizing volunteer activities that teach responsibility, teamwork, volunteering, and leadership following a set of rules.

The program aims to create peace, harmony, and togetherness by encouraging volunteering and teamwork in our country. De-suups, the volunteers, have done important work at home and abroad.

On February 14, the 13th De-suung Raising Day was celebrated in all 20 dzongkhags. There were prayers and offerings to His Majesty, followed by cutting a cake. Also, they launched the 5th De-suung annual magazine.

As we look back on these accomplishments, let's hope that the spirit of De-suung will keep guiding us together, showing unity, kindness, and strong commitment, which represent our special nation.

Passing Out Parade.

1,342 De-suup were trained for 21 days from February 5th to February 25th. During this time, there were four training centers where our new batch was trained: 373 De-suup were trained in Wing 1 (Tendruk), 449 in Wing IX (Pelrithang), 229 in Wing X (Deothang), and 291 in RBPTI (Jigmeling). In Wing 1 (Tendruk) training center, there were 27 De-suups with no education, 66 with middle school qualification, 157 with a 12th-grade qualification, 10 with a diploma, 66 with a degree, and one with a master's degree.





The youngest was 18 years old, the oldest 46, with an average age of 24 for the De-suups trained. The total number of De-suups trained has now risen to 44,117 (25,731 male and 18,386 female) up to the latest 61st batch.

Punakha Tshechu.

30 De-suups were involved in crowd management, serving, and night patrolling in the entertainment area alongside police personnel during the Punakha Tshechu.

The Punakha Tshechu takes place each February or March inside the

incredible Punakha Dzong, the ancient capital of Bhutan.

The event is scheduled for the first month of the lunar year and ends with the Serda, which is a colourful procession that re-enacts an episode of the war against Tibet in the 17th century.



It is unique for being the only festival with a procession like this. This vibrant festival features masked dances, religious ceremonies, and cultural event.

De-suups also assisted in security check-ups at various entry gates, not only during the Domchoe held from February 16th to 18th but during the subsequent also Punakha Tshechhu, which took place from February 19th to 21st.



Our vibrant De-suups were engaged in religious acts, crowd management, night patrolling, and serving, alongside generous Bhutanese sponsors. According to the Punakha Dzongkhag administration, approximately 10,000 people came forward to receive blessings during Domchoe, while around 200 tourists enjoyed the rich culture.

10TH Batch of DFS

De-suung Fire Service Welcomes 10th Batch of Volunteers. The 10th batch of De-suung Fire Service commenced their training on February 19th, comprising 30 dedicated De-suups. Over the course of two months, these volunteers will undergo rigorous training, including a one-month attachment at the Fire Service Division, RBP Changzamtok.



Since its inception, the De-suung office has successfully trained and awarded DFS certificates to 310 De-suups, marking a significant milestone in bolstering fire safety efforts across communities.

The opening ceremony of the 10th batch saw Dy. Chief Operations Officer (G), of RBA, Brigadier Ngawang Jigme, grace the event as the Chief Guest, emphasizing the importance of community involvement in fire prevention and response.
